Syllabus	
Learning Objectives	<b>Educational objectives:</b> The student will acquire a solid knowledge of the principles and rules underlying the functioning of international organizations, especially the UN, as they have been outlined in practice. The student will master the legal institutes learned during the course, in such a way as to solve cases in which the same institutes may come into play. To this end, and on the basis of the existing practice, cases will be put forth, which will have to be solved, following the method of discussions during the classes, along the lines of a legal trial. Through knowledge of the relevant acts and practice, the student will acquire the ability to analyze the evolution of international law in the field of its organization. The above-mentioned ability will be tested through discussions in class and by means of written reports. The student will have to show that he / she possesses the adequate jargon for the relevant field of knowledge, as well as communication skills that show the acquired ability to formulate convincing interpretation of the addressed issues. The student will have to show a rigorous method of analysis of the sector under consideration and the ability to use appropriate means for this purpose.
