Assessment	
Assessment methods	The method of verifying the expected learning outcomes is represented by the oral exam, which consists of a minimum of two questions on the teaching program. The vote is expressed in thirtieths. If the candidate does not demonstrate knowledge, at least sufficient, of basic topics in the teaching area, it will not be possible to proceed with the subsequent questions.
Assessment criteria	For each expected learning outcome above, describe what the student is expected to know or be able to do and at what level in order to demonstrate that a learning outcome has been achieved and at what level:  • Knowledge and understanding  • ability to discursively organize knowledge  • Applying knowledge and understanding  • Ability to analyze concrete cases proposed by the professor  • Autonomy of judgment  • critical reasoning skills on the study carried out  • Communicating knowledge and understanding  • quality of presentation, competence in the use of legal vocabulary  • Communication skills  • ability to deal with the analysis of legal texts, effectiveness and linearity of reasoning  • Capacities to continue learning  • systematically understand and interpret legal texts and documents in the light of the elements of knowledge and evaluation acquired
Final exam and grading criteria	The assessment of the learning level will take place with a final vote expressed out of thirty. Laude could be attributed by the professor to the students who have demonstrated an excellent level of knowledge.
	The exam is considered passed when the grade is greater than or equal to 18. The criteria followed for the evaluation of learning outcomes expressed in thirtieths are the following:
	Insufficient: 0-17 Lack of, incomplete and inadequate knowledge of the topics contained in the programme, inadequate exposition and argumentation skills, also with reference to the technical and conceptual lexicon of the discipline on the part of the candidates, insufficient processing skills and independent judgement.  Sufficient: 18-20
	Sufficient knowledge of the topics contained in the program, overall adequacy of the methods of expression and argumentation, also with reference to the technical and conceptual lexicon of the discipline, elementary processing skills and independent judgement.
	Fair: 21-23 Fair knowledge of the topics contained in the program, appreciable ability to use methods of expression suited to the technical and conceptual lexicon of the discipline, fair ability to argue, elaborate and connect the various topics.  Good: 24-26
	Good knowledge of the topics contained in the program, good ability for in-





depth analysis and independent judgement, which can also be verified through the use of methods of expression that are definitely suited to the technical and conceptual lexicon of the discipline. Distinguished: 27-28 More than good knowledge of all the topics contained in the program, capacity for in-depth analysis, connection between the different topics, very good critical autonomy and judgment and mastery of the methods of expression of the technical and conceptual lexicon of the discipline. Great: 29-30 Great knowledge of all the topics contained in the program, excellent ability for in-depth analysis, connection between the different topics, as well as critical autonomy and in-depth mastery of the methods of expression of the technical and conceptual lexicon of the discipline. Excellent: 30L Excellent knowledge of all the topics contained in the program, excellent ability for in-depth analysis, connection between the different topics, as well as critical autonomy and complete mastery of the methods of expression of the technical and conceptual lexicon of the discipline.
