Prerequisites	Know the fundamental junctions of Western history and hints of global history.
Teaching content (Program)	The course aims to provide the student with a basic knowledge of the general history of modern life. In the didactic activity, therefore, particular attention will be devoted to the major themes of the political, social, economic and cultural history of Europe and outside Europe between the end of the fifteenth and the beginning of the nineteenth century.

Teaching methods	Frontal teaching. Seminars on individual topics defined during the lessons and proposed to individual students on the basis of a specific bibliography.

Expected learning outcomes	Knowing how to orient oneself in historical epochs, providing adequate general features and knowing how to reconstruct the dynamics and underlying reasons.
Knowledge and understanding	Know the development of modern history, understand and recognize its junctions; be able to grasp, from a high level, the relationships of pluricausality and, on the other, to identify the political-institutional, socio-economic and cultural implications, contextualizing them.
Applied knowledge and understanding	Knowing how to distinguish the nature of the sources necessary for historical reconstruction and, starting from them, demonstrate the ability to reconstruct the historical "fact".
Soft skills	<p><i>Making judgements:</i> Acquire the basic skills to interact with the historical source and its interpretations, coming to formulate a motivated reading.</p> <p><i>Communication skills:</i> Acquire the specificity of the historical microlanguage, coming to name the actors, the phenomena, the processes placed under observation.</p> <p><i>Ability to learn autonomously:</i> Develop the ability to carry out documentary and bibliographic research on specific historical themes and independently formulate hypotheses and motivated readings of a historical phenomenon, based on sources, historiographical acquisitions and scientific debate.</p>
