Soft skills	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Making informed judgments and choices</i> The close relationship between the theoretical-planning phase and the application phase, between historical-theoretical knowledge and daily action, means that the study of philosophical anthropology extends the autonomy of judgment and confirms the assumption of responsibility by of students, in carrying out valid and effective actions both in the present and in the future. • <i>Communicating knowledge and understanding</i> The knowledge of man, of his origins and of his relationships with the world allows you to acquire hermeneutic and communicative skills that the student can use to guide the relational life with other men and with other beings in the world. • <i>Capacities to continue learning</i> Learning the world, understanding it through anthropological categories is equivalent to favoring a balance between theories and practices of life, understood as actions guided by a healthy and responsible use of reason and respect for human needs, on the incontrovertible basis of the widest and most profound respect. for all other forms of life.
