| Additional<br>information | The English Language Workshops are taught by native speaker language teachers. Students are<br>divided into three levels (pre-intermediate; intermediate; upper intermediate) in accordance<br>with their knowledge of the language. In the second half of September, before the courses<br>begin, students are required to register. Information on how to register will be published at<br>least two weeks before the courses begin.<br>Students attending courses will be required to pass an end-of-course test for which they must<br>register on Esse3; information regarding the date of the test will be provided by the language<br>teachers towards the end of the course.<br>Students in possession of a "non-attending student certificate" will be eligible to sit the exam<br>for non-attending students on dates which will be communicated to the administrative office<br>and indicated on the Esse3 platform.<br>The exam timetable for non-attending students can be consulted on the relevant degree course<br>website and on Esse3.<br>Students must register for the exam using the Esse3 system. |
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
