Content knowledge	<i>The course aims to direct students to study: a) the economic analysis of the law by analyzing the legal outcomes of the interaction of agents through the typical technique and evaluation of the economist; b) the concept of 'efficiency' of legal fact, according to the traditional canons of the microeconomy; (c) through the instrument of comparing the different economic outcomes that the legal norm entails, identifying how the legal standard should be directed and regulated in order to ensure maximum benefit to the parties.</i>
