Learning Objectives	Object of the course is the analysis of enforcement general rules, as described in the procedural civil code. This discipline represents an important phase of jurisdictional protection: the main purpose is to obtain the observance of the will of law and the material realization of the substantial rights. It constitutes a privileged observatory to study the relationships between substantial rights and the process itself. While the first part of the course is based on the analysis of the basic principles related to the concept of enforcement, the second part is centered on a more detailed study of the entire process related to the various enforcement proceedings.
