Expected learning outcomes	<p><i>Knowledge and understanding</i> students will be expected to know the fundamentals of historical and general linguistics; to have a basic knowledge of methods, theories and concepts of the discipline in both synchronic and diachronic perspectives.</p> <p><i>Applying knowledge and understanding</i> students will be expected to be able to analyze simple speech structures and to describe language changes taking into account the universal properties of languages and the parameters of language variation</p> <p><i>Making informed judgements and choices</i> students will be expected to be able of formulating simple hypotheses.</p> <p><i>Communicating knowledge and understanding</i> Students will be expected to be able to work independently and in groups; to express themselves clearly in speaking and writing by using the appropriate terminology; to interact with the teacher or the fellow students.</p> <p><i>Ability to continue learning</i> students will be expected to be able to continue the linguistic studies on their own, taking notes and consulting linguistic handbooks and their references.</p>
