<b>Content knowledge</b>	The development of Roman Ancient History from Rome foundation to 476 AD: the origin and the development of roman institutions; the territorial organization from the monarchic period to the Late Antiquity; documentary sources.

<b>Assessment methods</b>	<p>Oral-exam</p> <p>The exam timetable is published on the Degree Course website and on Esse3. To register for the exam, it is mandatory to use the Esse3 system.</p>

Final exam and grading criteria	<p>The measurement of learning and the assignment of the final grade will be carried out through the verification of students' acquisition of skills related to the interpretation of the historical phenomena, in their political-institutional, socio-economic, and cultural implications; to the interpretation of the historical sources and the related historiographical debate; and to the elaboration of personal points of view, correctly argued, through the use of the specific language of the discipline.</p> <p>As for measuring the achievement of these skills, reference will be made to the following assessment schema:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Insufficient assessment</li> <li>- 18-21: sufficient assessment</li> <li>- 22-24: fair assessment</li> <li>- 25-27: good assessment</li> <li>- 28-30 (with possible award of honours): excellent assessment</li> </ul>
