Assessment methods	The assessment will be conducted through an oral
	examination.
Assessment criteria	 Knowledge and understanding of the cous topics. Applying knowledge and understanding to reconstruct the main aspects of the international historiographic debate on the subject. Autonomy of judgment about case studies Communicating knowledge and understanding using the specific language of the discipline. Active participation in the course, constructive contribution to discussions and in-depth study of topics of the student's choice are considered useful elements for the evaluation of communication skills.
Final exam and grading criteria	Knowledge of the contents of the programme; mastery of the method and use of the language specific to the discipline; ability to place the sources examined in class in their context and to discuss them critically; quality of the oral expression. The final grade is awarded in thirtieths. The examination is deemed to be passed with a minimun grade of 18, according to the following scheme: - 18-21: sufficient assessment - 22-24: satisfactory assessment - 25-27: good assessment - 28-30 (with possible award of honours): very good or
