Contents	Starting from the definition and genealogy of visual culture (Pinotti, Somaini 2016) and according to a media studies perspective, the program focuses on some of the most fruitful research axes of the twentieth century towards the XXI century in line with the corresponding aesthetic references: from the imaginary of black ((dark, punk, fetish)) to that of blackness and darkness, developing a path that takes into account the affirmation of an "aesthetic of malaise" which sees in the movement of #blacklivesmatter one of its outlets. Cinema, music videoclips, photography and social networks make up the corpus of signs and materials on which to base the interpretation of the contemporary and the reality plans mediated by technology.
