Learning objectives	<p>The course aims at analysing the English language as the language of Port traffic and trade.</p> <p>Fundamentals to the course will be taken into account as per ESP (English for Specific Purposes). The objective is to provide the students with multi-disciplinary approaches in the field of international English applied to Maritime contexts.</p> <p>Module 1 is worth of 3 credits and will focus on morphology, syntax and pronunciations features to consolidate any background knowledge;</p> <p>Module 2 worth of 3 credits will focus on ESP vocabulary items to develop a pragmatic knowledge. si focalizzerà sul lessico specialistico e sullo sviluppo di una competenza pragmatica.</p>		
Prerequisites	<p>No preliminary knowledge is required. However, it is recommended that the 4 basic skills (receptive and productive) reach B1/B2 of the CEFR levels.</p> <p>Syntax and grammar should be consolidated prior to the course to make smoother in terms of learning and acquisition.</p>		
Teaching strategies	<p>Lectures, projects, discussions and case studies. English is seen as a language in evolution and so emergent data will be taken into account. The course is enhanced by the use of coherent and relevant matials, even digitally.</p> <p>.</p>

Specifically the test will assess: knowledge of lexis and grammar; accuracy and fluency and interactivity at a semantic level, promptness and responsive answers.</p> <p><u>- minimus timing required 15 minutes</u> <u>- glossaries or dictionaries made available if needed</u></p>
<p>Assessment criteria</p>	<p>Knowledge and understanding</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • using grammar structures easily and fluently to prove vocabulary right and presentation of clear and proper knowledge/concepts <p>Applying knowledge and understanding</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • students prove their acquired knowledge by organising their discourse and answers effectively without any help or stimuli by the professor <p>Autonomy of judgment</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • students show their abilities to make informed judgement and comments analysing the questions and proposing their points of view backed up by the concepts of the course • Communicating knowledge and understanding <p>students implement ESP language wisely and effectively and there is no need for the professor to elicit answers</p> <p>Capacities to continue learning</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • students are more inclined and have improved their abilities to do research by self-organising the materials
<p>Final exam and grading criteria</p>	<p>Students shall demonstrate to master the language as much fluent as they can to convey the meanings without much effort and in a straightforward way. Also, the technical and ES_p language should be used effectively and without much hesitation.</p> <p>The grade is expressed in a marking system where 18 is the minimum required to pass the exam and 30 is the maximum.</p> <p>The exam is intended passed with merit (i.e. 30 cum laude) when the performance is quite smooth, correct and accurate, fluent corroborating the knowledge and abilities improved throughout the course.</p> <p>Problem-solving skills and effectiveness of ESP vocabulary will be particularly appreciated when analysing real-life scenarios and case-studies</p> <p>If the students show a good command of the language in all the features concerning the oral skills and without or little help by the teacher, the exam will be succesful and marked at best.</p>
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
