Knowledge and understanding on:	The teaching of Transport Law aims to provide students with basic notions about the legal regulation of the maritime, air, rail and road transport sector in the public and private sphere. A good knowledge of international and internal sources is provided, as well as of the main public and private institutions and the necessary stimuli to approach this sector in which specialized knowledge and an interdisciplinary approach are required.
Applying knowledge and understanding on:	The student will make the basic notions his own, learning a method of analysis of the legal aspects related to the organization of maritime, air, rail and road

	transport; furthermore, the course provides the conditions for acquiring professional skills that can be spent in the logistics and intermodal sectors, acquiring the technical-legal language of the sector and the ability to manage specific employment relationships in the transport sector.
Soft skills	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Making informed judgments and choices</i> <p>The course aims at the student's understanding of the functioning of the transport chain by grasping its evolutionary lines in the context of liberalization and privatization processes, in particular port and airport regulations, thus stimulating an understanding of the current dynamics of the market and the local reality. This stimulates independent judgment and a critical approach.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Communicating knowledge and understanding</i> <p>At the end of the course, the student will have acquired the legal vocabulary necessary to face and cover job positions in the transport sector, in particular in the public sector, as well as in the private sector to provide advice on concrete issues, through the analysis of the regulatory framework.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Capacities to continue learning</i> <p>The course offers the basic knowledge of Transport Law, aiming to give the student a good ability in legal analysis. Finally, through the study of current affairs, it offers students the basic knowledge to understand the reality of national and international traffic.</p>
