Content knowledge	The first part of the course will be devoted to: main features of the communicative process, verbal and multimodal communication, persuasive communication, miscommunication. The communicative dynamics will be explored in relation to the following contexts: A) Communication and discommunication B) Communicative conflicts and solving strategies C) Public communication D) Political communication E) Health communication F) Communication of risks and dangers. The second part of the course will deepen the psychosocial dynamics and social communication processes through the Internet: identity and perception; aggressiveness, attractiveness and prosociality online, online group activities, gaming online, sexuality in internet.
