Visa and temporary residence in Italy

In this section we report useful information on visa and current regulations on short visits for study/research purposes in Italy.

All students are strongly recommended to acquire the necessary information on how to apply and obtain a visa.

EU citizens

Students that are citizen of EU countries or Switzerland, Norway, Liechtenstein, Iceland, Andorra, Monaco, Repubblica di San Marino and Città del Vaticano are free to circulate and reside in Italy up to 3 months. Exchange students (Erasmus+ and other programmes including GlobalDoc) are allowed to reside temporarily in Italy for more than 3 months without any formality. A valid national ID document is sufficient.

Non-EU Students


BEFORE DEPARTURE

Before departure you need to apply for a visa and check info for the health insurance

Visa. Non EU visiting students that intends to stay in Italy for more than 90 days should apply for a study visa. For visits below 90 days, visa might be necessary or not depending on your nationality.

4 Questions to find out if you need a visa for Italy

Health Insurance. The University of Bari will cover a basic health insurance. If you want to purchase additional insurance in your country (valid for Italy) you should take it to the consulate/embassy with other documents and make sure that it is validated.

UPON ARRIVAL IN ITALY

Non EU students staying more than 90 days have to apply for the permit to stay (permesso di soggiorno) within 8 working days from entry in Italy.

The University of Bari will help you in the application. A kit containing modules and instructions can be obtained from selected postal offices (Sportello Amico).
