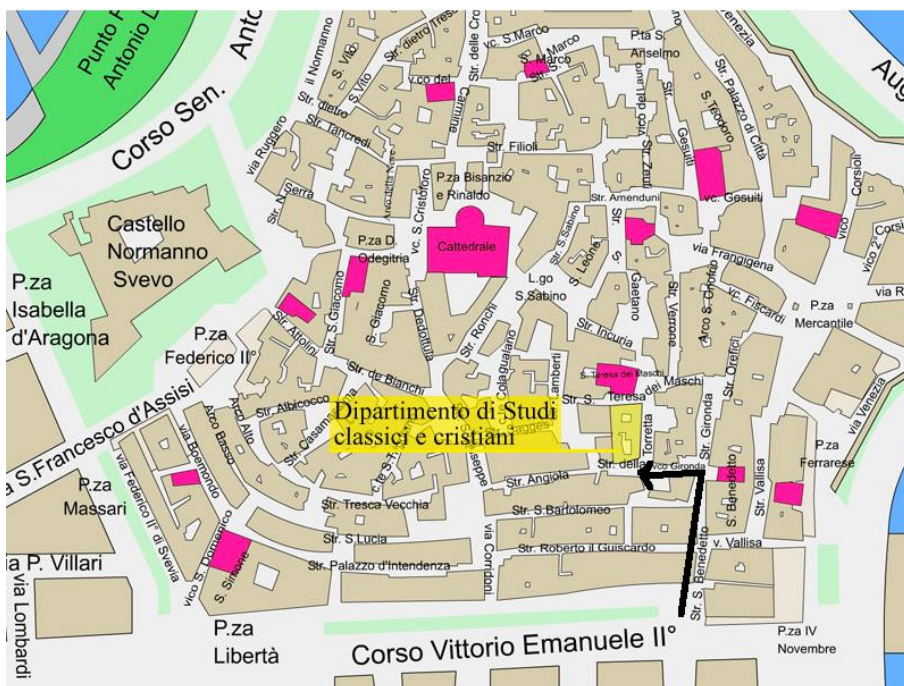

After less than 100 meters you will find on your left the “Carabinieri”. Turn left and proceed for a few meters in a narrow lane.
